Yew Class visit The Watercress Line



“On Tuesday 12th November 2019, Yew Class went on a school trip to the Watercress Line to learn about how trains were in Victorian Times. We learnt about who built the railways and what it was like before the steam trains came to Hampshire. The trains made a big difference to everyday lives. Before the trains were built, you would have to travel around in horse and cart and it would take ages to get to London!

We explored the Alresford and Ropley railway stations and learnt a lot about the steam trains. We then did a workshop where we acted out a role play on different times when the railways were built in the Victorian age. At lunchtime, we each wrote a postcard as if we were someone in

the time when the steam trains were built. We performed our role plays to the class and it helped us to learn more about the railways.

We found out lots of facts including the fact that the Navvies cut away the chalk on the banks to help level out the ground so they could build the train tracks. Another fact is that there were different classes on the train (first class, second class and third class). First class had all comfy seats and they would have a bench per person. Second class would have comfy seats but they would have to share a bench with other people. Third class would not have comfy seats and would have to squish together on one bench and they would be in an open carriage. If you were royal, you would have a whole carriage to yourself. Queen Victoria even had her own station in Gosport.

We had lunch in the station. Did you know that there was a ladies waiting room where it was nice and warm with coal fires? The men, however, had to wait outside. There would be a station master and if a man went into the ladies room they would call the station master.

The whole of Yew class had an amazing time and we learnt a lot more about the railways, which will help us with our work.




Remembrance Service at St Mary's Church


This year there will be shelves suited to three different age ranges, as well as all the wonderful stationary for the children to enjoy. There will also be a catalogue of additional books available to order for older children.
