**Core subjects**

Find out why bees are endangered and what we could plant to help them. Present your findings to share with the class.	On squared paper (available from school) make a design of your dream garden.	Recycle a plastic bottle or container and make a bug hotel to be put in our garden.
Find or invent a recipe using a vegetable that you might grow in your garden.	Make a miniature version of a garden. Use any materials of your choice.	Design a poster to encourage children to refuse, reduce, reuse ,recycle and recover.
