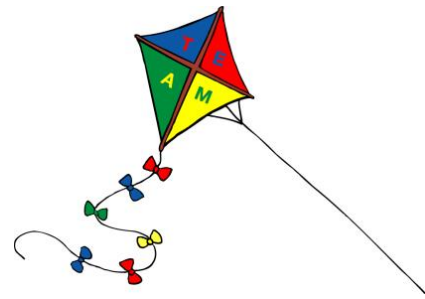

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Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the physical education (PE), physical activity and sport they provide. This includes any carried forward funding from the 2019 to 2020 academic year.

This means that at TSM, we use the PE and sport premium to:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport
- build capacity and capability within school

Schools should use the PE and sport premium to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2. Profile of PE and sport is raised across the school
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

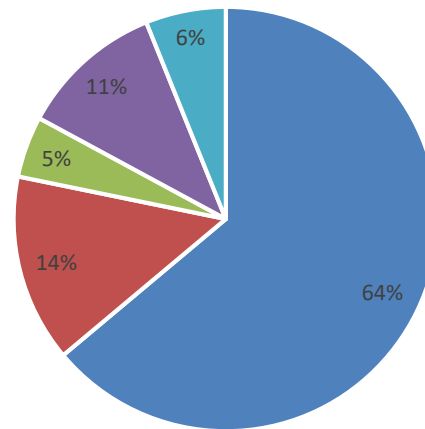
